Lom was interned at Huyton Camp during the War, alongside other emigre artists such as John Heartfield, Martin Bloch and Hugo Dachinger, and wrote a memoir of his time there 'Never Mind, Mr Lom', published in 1941. A number of his works are in the Ben Uri Gallery & Museum collection, where he also received a retrospective exhibition in 1954.
