The Vienna Secession was an art movement formed in 1897 by a group of Austrian artists, sculptors and architects who resigned from the Association of Austrian Artists in order to pursue their own artistic style - the beginning of modern art in Austria. The group included eminent artists such as Gustav Klimt, Egon Schiele, Koloman Moser and Josef Hoffmann.
